Busy Spring Season Close, Congrats to our Grads, Huge Summer LTR and Booming Fall Membership!

No idle time at the Boathouse as we closed out the Youth and Adult Racing Season with the Southeast Regionals and Masters Nationals respectively. This was followed by the Summer Learn to Rows, Returners Camp and a June 5th Adult Regatta featuring 6 teams from around the state. In the midst of all of that, LCRA Coaches, Parents and Volunteers celebrated the High School Athletes and their 7 Graduates along with the 18 new Freshmen coming from the Middle School Program at a very successful end of year banquet. Additionally, LCRA played host to Head Coach Mark Rothstein and the University of Michigan's Women's National Championship contenders. Much to be thankful for and much to look forward to as we look forward to a busy Fall Racing Season.

The Summer LTR set a record for 112 Youth weekly Camps as well as record Adult LTR session. As of September the Club now has 146 Athletes across all 3 programs!

LCRA won two gold medals at the USRowing Masters National Championships. The Men's four-person team brought home gold in their age bracket. The group included Lake County Commissioner Doug Shields, LCRA President Mark Vantrease, and brothers Bill and Dan VanDresser. The next day, the VanDresser brothers went on to win gold in the Open F Double bracket. The team spent their mornings on Lake Minneola in Clermont honing their skills to ensure they were faster than the previous year, where they missed out on gold by just three seconds.
